

Elizabeth May Wilson

Elizabeth was born on August 14, 1903 on the farm south of Almena, Kansas to Elmer & Eva Wilson. She had two older sisters - Grace and Minnie - and three older brothers - Roy, Earl, and Ralph & three younger brothers, Delmer, Elmer, and Harold.

She married Thomas Baldwin (Tom) on August 5, 1925 in Goodland, Kansas. Tom was born on September 8, 1903 in Nekoma, Kansas.

They lived most of their lives in and near Nekoma, Kansas, where they farmed west of town.

Three children – Albert Merle (Merle), Peggy, and Melva. Melva lived only five months and eleven days. Both Peggy and Melva was born on the same date - March 29, two years apart.

Tom died from cancer on July 27, 1972 and was buried in the cemetery at Nekoma, Kansas. Elizabeth died November 5, 1976 and was buried beside Tom in Nekoma, Kansas, where her parents, Elmer & Eva Wilson, are also buried. She also has a brother/ sister-in-law - Elmer & Elva - and a brother-in-law - Frank West* - buried there.

*Frank West is a nephew by marriage to Aunt Elizabeth. He was married to Betty Wilson (West) Janke. Betty was Elmer and Elva's daughter. Also buried near the plot where Uncle Tom and Aunt Elizabeth are buried, is Uncle Harold and Aunt Agnes (sister-in-law) and Floyd W. Wilson, (nephew).

Aunt Elizabeth was a great cook. (Floyd, I'm sure you remember some Sunday dinners there). Aunt Elizabeth was good at forgetting a salad or something in the refrigerator for dinner. She always made enough food for dinner and supper. She would take the forgotten dish out for supper. No one usually knew she had forgotten it for dinner. We finally got to where we asked her if everything was on the table (in case she did her little trick of forgetting a salad or something. We certainly had plenty to eat there.

Uncle Tom always had a sack of candy hidden in the kitchen. When the kids got there, they knew he'd have some.

My older girls remember playing grocery store on the back porch of their house. I remember the toy the kids loved, the mama duck pulling the babies and they rattled and rattled when you ran with them. One Sunday I heard Uncle Tom tell Floyd and his dad that 'that toy's got to go'. It finally did disappear.
