Mr. K. with them, and with them he remained until November, 1882, when he returned to this place and set up in business.

July 19, 1882, at Kewanee, Mr. Kreidler was married to Miss Capitola Lampson, a lovely and accomplished young lady, who yielded up her life April 1, 1883, and with that of her new-born babe.

That Mr. Kreidler inherited nothing may be understood from his history; that he has been successful in business is known from his standing. He is a prominent Mason, and, we believe, a Republican.

Johnson Lorenzo Wilson, residing on section 27, located adjoining the town of Galva, is a native of Ohio. He was born in St. Albans Tp., Licking Co., that State, Aug. 2, 1832. The parents of Mr. Wilson of this sketch were Seuel and Esther (Burnett) Wilson. He was born in New Hampshire, and died in Jay County, Ind., in July, 1857, having removed to Ohio, that State, in 1846. He was a farmer by occupation, and in his religious belief was, from the time he attained the age of manhood, a member of the Baptist Church. His father, grandfather of our subject, was born in New Jersey, was of English extraction, and a soldier of the Revolutionary War; was a farmer by occupation and died in Ohio. Seuel Wilson was a soldier in the War of 1812. Mr. Wilson's parents lived and died in Indiana.

J. L. Wilson, of whom we write, received his education principally in Ohio. He removed with his parents into Indiana, and from there came to this State, in 1854, stopping in Peoria County. He remained there until the spring of that year, when he moved near Elmwood, Knox County, this State, where he followed the occupation of farming for three years. At the expiration of this time, in 1857, he came to Galva, in the neighborhood of which village he rented land and was occupied in its cultivation for two years. Previous to moving here he had purchased land, which during the last few years mentioned he improved as time would permit. At first he purchased 80 acres, which he afterward sold and purchased another 80 east of the present village of Galva. He subsequently bought 40 acres more, and then sold the 120 acres, and with the proceeds purchased 100

acres adjoining the present village of Galva, the same being located on section 27, Galva Township, and on which he at present resides.

Mr. Wilson was united in marriage April 11, 1861, with Miss Amanda M. Herbert. She was born in Lewistown, Fulton Co., Ill., in 1842. She has borne him seven children: Lillian M., Ralph L., Fred H., Walter, Myrtie E., Katie and Ethel L. Mr. and Mrs. Wilson, together with their children, Lillian and Ralph, are members of the Baptist Church. Politically, Mr. Wilson indorses the party which advocates prohibition.

Mra D. Marston, a practicing attorney, resident at Cambridge, was born April 30, 1838, in Parsonsfield, York Co., Maine. His ancestral progenitors were pioneers of New England, and their genealogy is now in process of compilation (1885). David Marston, his grandfather, was a Revolutionary soldier. His father, Jacob Marston, was born in Parsonsfield, Maine. He was a stone-cutter by occupation and died at Parsonsfield, as did his wife, Martha (Doe) Marston. They had 11 children. The mother was the daughter of John and Abigail Doe, and her parents of English extraction.

Mr. Marston grew to the age of 17 years in New England. At 14 he became the arbiter of his own fortunes, and at 17 he came to Henry County, on foot and alone, with not an acquaintance west of New England. He worked one season on a farm in Clover Township, when he entered diligently upon the work of securing an education, employing his leisure to the best possible advantage in study. At 18 he taught school for the first time in Clover Township. He alternately taught and attended school three years.

In July, 1861, he entered the army, enlisting in the 42d Ill. Vol. Inf., in Company B. In August, 1862, he received an honorable discharge for disability. In June, 1865, he began the study of law, which he prosecuted with energetic perseverance, and in November, 1867, was admitted to practice in the State Courts of Illinois. Later he was admitted to the privileges of the Federal Courts. In 1869 he formed a partnership with Judge J. S. Hinman, and

The schoolhouse soon became too small to accommodate the audience and the church resolved to build a larger house, on, or near, the town plot of Alexandria. Encouraged by Professor Drury of Granville College, who had now become pastor, a larger, more central, but flimsy structure was erected in 1834, near where the new one now stands. This house was enclosed and seated with slabs from the saw-mill, holes being bored and legs inserted to support them. It was never plastered and had, I think, no way of warming.

Right here let me introduce you to old Mother Atwood. Here she comes, with a muff in one hand and in the other a small box covered with perforated tin. What can she have in that little box? Surely not her Bible and hymn-book. I will tell you; the small box is called a foot-stove and is filled with live coals from the fireplace. By placing her feet upon the stove and inserting her hands in the muff, she manages to keep comfortable while the rest of us shiver with the cold. Mother Atwood kept what was called a Baptist Minister's hotel, at which the tired minister was always sure of a hearty welcome and a good night's rest.

The meetinghouse soon needed repairs or finishing, but, on circulating a subscription paper for the purpose, less than one hundred dollars was obtained. Asa Gurney and Orren Bryant then took the matter in hand, and, in two days, secured pledges for fourteen hundred dollars. Thus it became evident that a new and much better structure could be built, rather than repair the old one. It was ordered sold in 1838, and the proceeds invested in free seats in the new one. It was abandoned after a life of four years and died a natural death as a part of Mr. Buxton's barn.

On the 25th of March, 1839, a contract for building the new house was made with Suel Wilson and Silas Burnett, the consideration being six hundred dollars; one hundred dollars down, one hundred when the house was enclosed, two hundred in September and two hundred in January. The house was built according to contract, and the basement was plastered and seated and became the home of the church for four years. The church, after many attempts usually resulting in failures, finally reported the house finished in 1844, when the association met at Alexandria. The church bell, I presume, was secured about that time. There is no record of any formal dedication, though some persons living have a distinct recollection of the occurrence, differing only as to who preached the sermon.

I think few persons of this generation have any just conception of the amount of personal sacrifice endured and hard labor performed in building so good a house at such a time. Like the ancient horseshoe which had to be wrought out at the anvil by the hammer of the blacksmith, so the church must be fashioned from the green trees of the forest by the use of the ax, the saw and the plane, without the aid of modern machinery or a supply of ready-made material. They had little money to contribute, so the subscription must be paid in hard labor, every one doing that he could do best. Enos and Levi Nichols laid the foundation walls; Asa and John Gurney furnished the black walnut for the siding, shingles and inside work; Truman Curtis made the sash and doors; Orren Bryant and John Gurney did the plastering; Augustus Castle and Charles Stewart furnished the timber for the frame. But it is useless to mention names; each one did all he could, and every one did something. Home demands were pressing and the subject most frequently discussed was, how to furnish food and clothes for the numerous house-

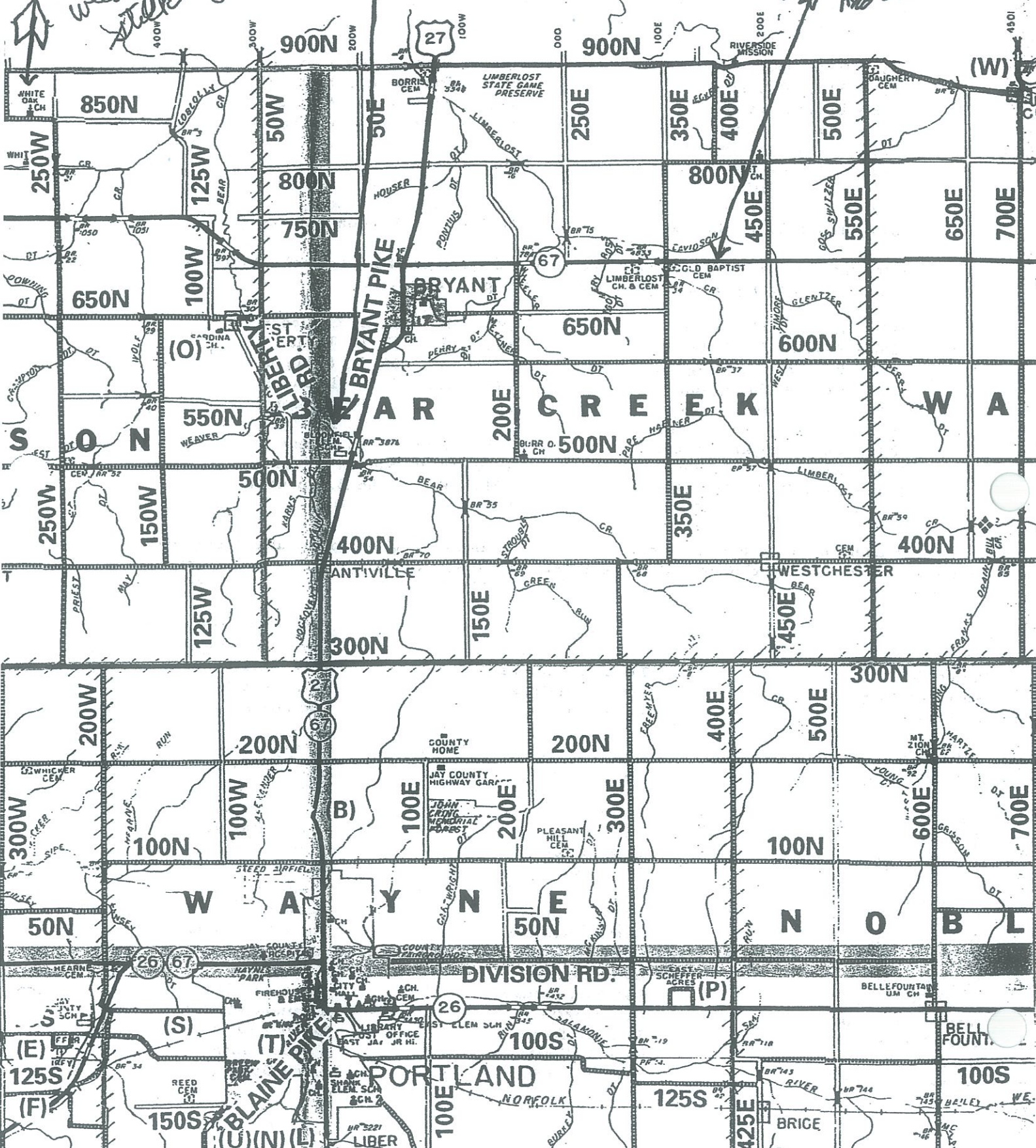
