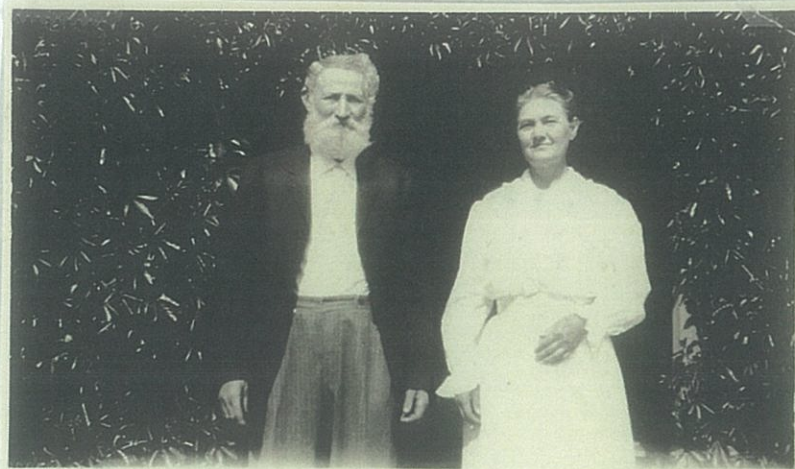

Judson & Mariah Wilson

Judson C. Wilson was born on June 10, 1838 in Licking County, Ohio. He died on March 27, 1923 in Lyford, Willacy Country, Texas.

Judson was a young man when his parents moved from Ohio to Jay country, Indiana. Judson was united in marriage to Mariah Stanly on December 12, 1861. They had four boys and three girls. Judson was a soldier in the Civil War, receiving an honorable discharge at the close of the war. He was in the 89th Indiana Infantry.

On April 1, 1878, they moved from Indiana to Kansas by covered wagon. They settled on a homestead, west of Prairie View, Kansas. There they built a house that was part dugout and part sod. Here he resided until 1907, when he moved to Lyford, Texas, where he lived until his death, March 27, 1923. Judson's body was shipped back to Prairie View, where he was buried beside his wife, Mariah and daughter, Lydia. Mariah died September 30, 1905.

(Mariah is spelled wrong on her headstone, "Maria". They tried to correct it, but the carver said there wasn't enough room for the "H". That is why some say Mariah should spell Maria.

Miriah Stanley-----My mother's dad & mother

Mamma's maiden name was Wilson, and her mother's maiden name was Stanley.

Sept.1682 Penn and about 200 passengers set sail from London on the "Welcome". This was evidently his first trip to the New World. He had been rear-admiral & Vice admiral of Ireland & in 1652, Vice admiral of England. He was Captain- commander under King James II by whom he was knighted.

March 4,1681 Charles II granted William Penn a charter for a tract of land in the New World bounded on the east by the Delaware River, west limited by the province of Maryland, north to extend as far as plantable.

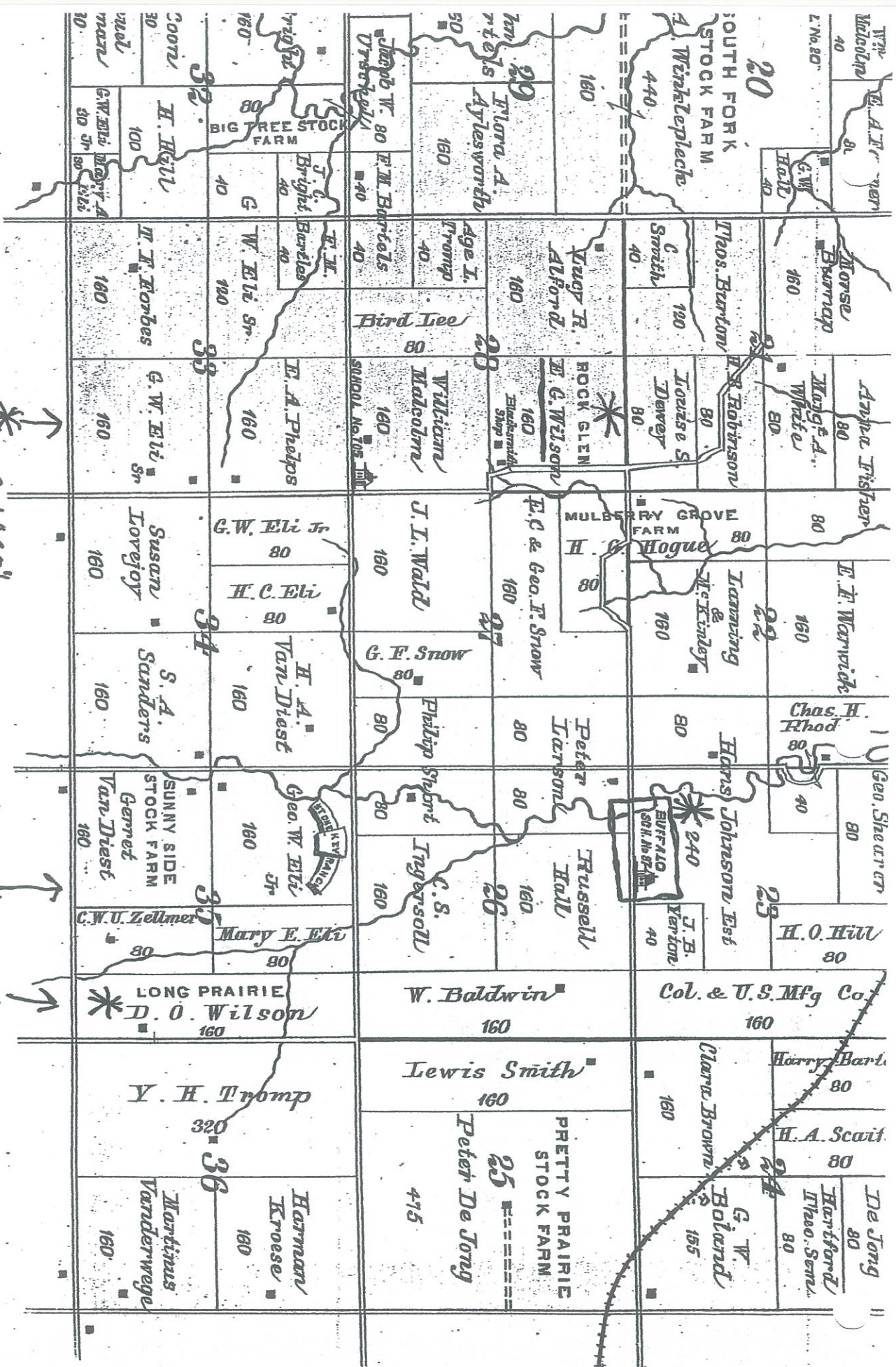

Judson C. Wilson was born on June 10th, 1839 in Licking county Ohio. He departed this life on March 27, 1923, at his home in Lyford, Texas, aged 83 years, 9 months and 17 days. When a young man his parents moved from Ohio to Jay county, Indiana, where he was united in marriage to Mariah Stanley, on December 12, 1861. To this union were born four boys and three girls. Four of these survive the father. They are Elmer Wilson, of Jerome Kansas, Zerepha Stuart, of Englewood, Kansas; Mary C. Landreth, of Rayfield, Colorado and D. O. Wilson, of Prairie View. In the spring of 1878 he moved with his family from Indiana to Kansas, settling on a homestead in Norton county, three miles west of Prairie View. Here he resided until 1907, when he moved to Lyford, Texas, where he lived until his death. The body was shipped back to Prairie View last Saturday. Here he was laid to rest last Sunday beside his wife, who preceded him on the way all flesh must go, several years ago. D. O. Wilson Dies After Long Illness

The passing of Mr. D. O. Wilson at his home in Almena on April 1, marks the end of the trail for one of Norton County's highly respected pioneer citizens. He endured all the trials and vicissitudes of pioneer life, made friends wherever he went because he was a friend to all, and closed his career in the knowledge of a life well spent and of an eternal reward.

David Orlando Wilson, son of Judson and Mariah Wilson, was born May 11, 1873 and departed this life April 1, 1949, at the age of 75 years, 10 months, and 20 days. His parents and family left Indiana, April 1, 1878 in a covered wagon and came to Kansas, locating on a homestead three miles west of Prairie View. There they built a part dugout and part sod house for a home. He was married on January 4, 1899 to Ida M. Short. To this union were born one daughter and three sons. One son, Oren, preceded him in death. To mourn his passing are his wife, Ida, one daughter, Mrs. Olive Roeder, Prairie View; two sons, Donald of Almena, Kansas, and Daniel of Phillipsburg, Kansas; nine grandchildren, one (Calvin Roeder) is serving in the United States Navy; and two great-grandchildren, many other relatives and a host of friends.

He was converted when he was a young man and became a member of the Methodist Church, later joining the Baker Evangelical Church where he remained a faithful member throughout his life. He will be sadly missed by the Church and all who had the privilege of meeting him.

He had been in failing health for a number of years and bed fast for the past 3½ months. He was a patient and cheery sufferer. When visiting his sickroom one went away feeling that they had been encouraged to do that which was right for he always had a good word to say and that his hope and trust was in Jesus. He held at times many offices of the church and Sunday School and was president of the South East District of Norton County for many years.

David O. Wilson was born March 3, 1871 in Jay county, Indiana, and came to Norton county, Kansas, with his parents in 1878 where he grew to manhood and was respected by all who knew him. He was married to Edna B. Norris Aug. 5, 1905, who preceded him one year and two months to rest. About two weeks before his death Mr. Wilson was taken suddenly ill with appendicitis and was taken to Christ's hospital, Ponoka, where an operation was performed but he only lived one week and departed this life at 2:20 a. m. June 5, 1908, aged 37 years, 2 months and 28 days. The funeral services were conducted by J. R. Thompson of Norton, Kans., and the K. O. G. P. lodge of Prairie View of which he was a member and the body laid to rest in the Prairie View cemetery. There was a goodly number present from neighboring lodges—Almema, Logan, Phillipsburg, Norton and Edmond. He leaves a father, two brothers, two sisters and a little son besides a host of friends to mourn his loss.

Mr. Wilson was a splendid citizen and neighbor. Having lived here the most of his life, he had won a host of friends. His body was followed to its last resting place by a large concourse of sorrowing friends. Over 300 were at the casket to show their respects for the departed friend and neighbor. The pall bearers were brothers of the Mystic Order: Frank Gay, Frank Thomas, Bert Brown, John Van Diest, John Garber, son and Henry Boogaart.

WILSON DIES AT TEXAS HOME

FORMER JAY COUNTY MAN'S
BODY ARRIVED FRIDAY AF-
TERNOON—FUNERAL

1909

The body of Stephen ~~W.~~ Wilson, a former resident of this county who died at the home of his brother Judson C. Wilson, in Texas, was brought to Bryant Friday afternoon, arriving at 2:30 o'clock, on the train from the south. It was taken to the Baptist church, east of town, for the usual services.

During the civil war, the deceased was a captain in the 59th Indiana Volunteer Infantry. He left this county 25 years ago, being at the time of his death 75 years of age. He has two sons surviving, one residing at Matthews, the other at Converse, Indiana. His wife died several years ago.

He was a brother-in-law of Dr. M. A. Glentzer of Bryant.
