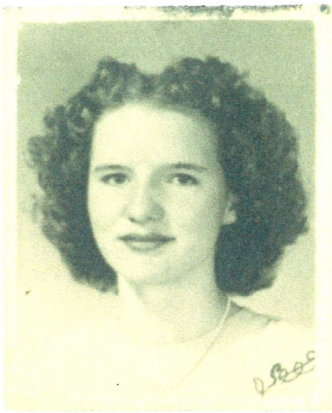

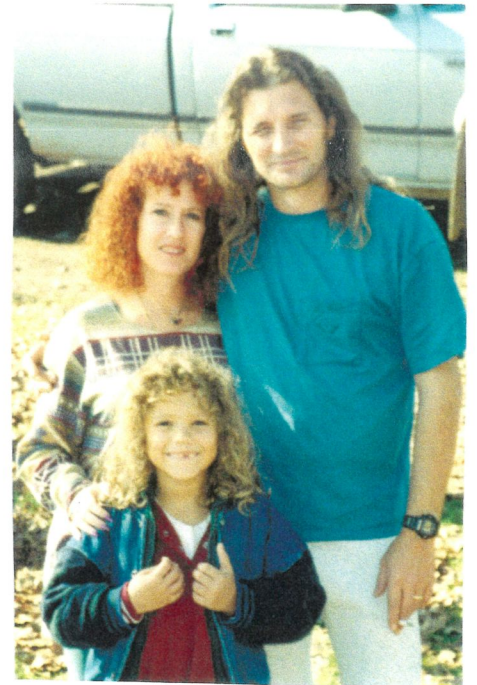

MY MEMORIES OF LIFE AS A CHILD

We went to church, Methodist Church in Gove, Ks. Mother always wrapped a nickel or 5 pennies in a hankie for our Sunday School money. We walked 5 ? to church. Daddy was a teacher. I was in 1st grade. Sometimes we walked thru our goat pasture going to school. Sometimes he would chase us kids. We had a white milk cow. All 6 of us kids sat on her back and had our pictures taken. She was a pet.

We moved to our farm near Jerome. Daddy was our teacher – 8 grades in one room school. He was the cook. We had hot lunches, janitor and ect. (?) We children would set the table and do the dishes. We sometimes had hot cocoa. Max Wilson was in the 8th grade. We gave him the aluminum cup. He liked hot cocoa. We have nice “outhouses”. They were built by W.P.A. government program. The “Gunnery Range” took in a large area, including our school so it was moved to our basement for several years. The Gunnery Range had planes from Wichita fly over and shoot at a target pulled by another plane – practice for the war. We were ½ mile out of the range. We were playing soft ball and a bullet came whizzing by Loyd Wilsons hand as he pitched for me. We dug it up – it was still warm. Daddy was the teacher; mother was the teacher the next year. Daddy had heart problems and his health was failing.

We kids entertained ourselves. Our neighbors lived miles away. We played hide and seek in the cane field. Went barefoot all summer. Keith and I rescued baby pigeon. It had no feathers. We took care of it – named it “Pigeon Goon”. She would set on our shoulder when we went after the cows. It would fly to strangers landing on their head or shoulders. They were surprised! I had 3 bantje chickens. They lived in the yard in a shelter. They were so pretty. The farm was always full of animals and pets.

We had a well house. Daddy fixed a 50 gallon barrel with water to run thru it, for our refrigerator. We put milk, butter & etc. in jars.

When we moved to the farm, the basement was finished. The first floor was finished later. It was interesting to me to see it finished.

Daddy used the neighbor barber. He cut all our hair and lots of neighbors. It was great when Uncle Delmer and family came up for haircuts. We had cousins to play with.

With your parents as your teachers, we were expected to behave and have our lessons. We played “annie over” the school house played ball, “fox & geese”, and a snow circle game. We had 3 swings and 2 teeter totters at school. We jumped rope.

Dean and Keith got into a hens nest. The eggs were rotten, they of course broke them. Oh, how they smelled. DeLila had them change clothes. Mother and daddy was after another load of furniture as we were moving that day.

We canned garden produce and peaches. We kids belong to 4-H. Keith had duror hogs. I canned peaches, won the Blue Ribbon! We took garden produce, chickens and sewing.

Keith and I saved overalls for a toy rabbit. We had a sewing machine, you turn it by hand, Keith turned it, I sewed, turned out nice.

Janie and I jumped rope, single and double ropes. We learned to jump to many different steps. Janie put it to music and jumped for other schools. She was good and we spent many hours at it.

We had a huge clothes line. With 8 in the family, wash day was a busy day. Had 4 cloths lines full of clothes, summer and winter. I liked wash day. I learned to iron with a little "flat" iron. It was heated on the stove. I ironed Daddy's hankies at six (?) – loved it.

Rex, as a small child had curly hair. Keith and Dean had wavy hair. We girls had straight hair.
