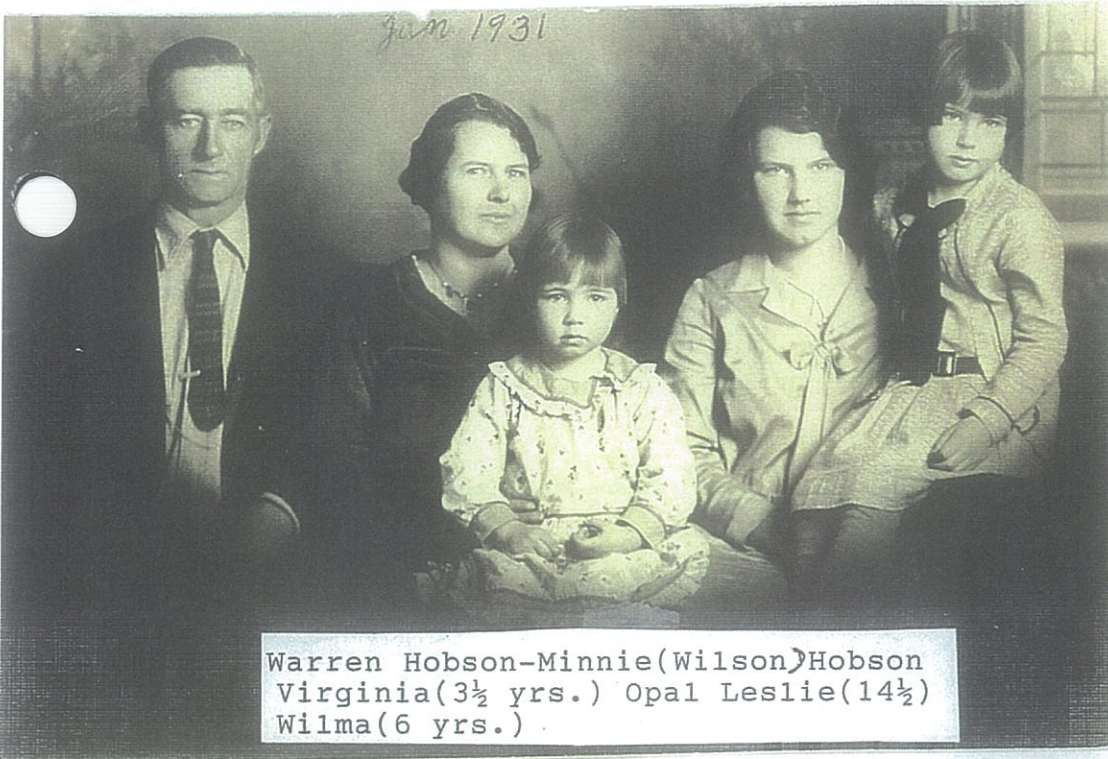

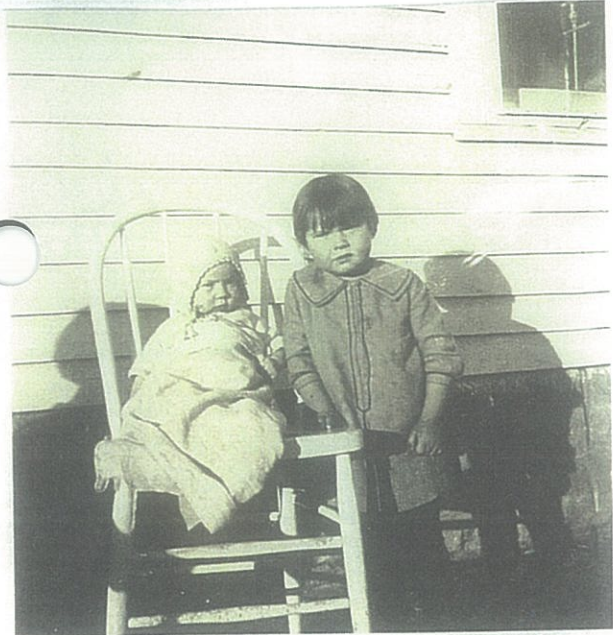

MINNIE ROSELLA WILSON

Minnie was born August 14, 1898 at or near Almena, Kansas. She was the fifth child of Elmer Gardner and Eva Carolyn Snow Wilson. She attended school in (or near) Almena, before her family moved to Waldron, Kansas where she attended school there. She married James Tyler Leslie at Waldron. To them a daughter was born. Shortly after the daughter (Opal Mae) was born, Minnie and James divorced. (I'm sure Minnie lived with her parents after she was divorced). The family moved to or near Jetmore, Kansas (not sure where they moved to after leaving Jetmore). I don't know when they moved to Nekoma, Kansas. While at Nekoma, Minnie married, March 3, 1924 to Warren Hobson.

Warren was a truck-gardner, raised watermelons, cantaloupes and cucumbers for a living. To Warren and Minnie five children were born. When product was ready to sell, Minnie attended the stand, selling the products, while Warren attended to the garden. He drove horse and buggy to gather the products and to deliver to the stores. Minnie canned fruits and vegetables. When she would be at the garden selling the products, Opal also had the job of the house work, cooking and canning.

Minnie was a wonderful cook. She sewed the girl's dresses. She couldn't afford to buy patterns, so she'd look at catalogs, and cut a pattern for a dress she saw. She loved to crochet, and would see in a paper or book the crochet piece she liked, and she'd make that piece, counting the stitches. She liked to embroidery and also piece quilt tops.

In 1932 Warren and Minnie and children moved from Nekoma, Kansas to Alexander, Kansas, where he continued gardening. Warren always planted every kind of vegetable that would grow and Minnie spent a lot of the summer canning vegetables. In 1939 they moved a mile west of Alexander and Warren retired from making a big garden.

January 1943 Warren, Minnie and the children moved to Bartlesville, OK. Warren had a job as janitor of a small rural school at the west edge of Bartlesville. The school was named Labadie Heights. The community had church services each Sunday in the auditorium and Warren and Minnie were in charge of the janitor services for the church services.

Minnie had high blood pressure and had a stroke March 1949 and was unconscious in the hospital 28 days. She had some affects from the stroke but was not paralyzed. She had a massive stroke the third of May 1950 and died May 4th at 1:30 A.M. She was buried May 6th at the White House Rose Cemetery at Bartlesville, OK.

Mother was a very gentle and pleasant person, a loving mother and wife. She was always ready to help anyone that needed her. She was faithful to God and our Lord Jesus and helped her children to know Him.

Warren Hobson Dies; Funeral Set Monday

Warren Hobson, 85, a Bartlesville resident since 1943, died at 6:00 a.m. Saturday in the Washington County Memorial Hospital where he had been a patient for the past three weeks.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m., Monday in the Arnold Moore Chapel. Rev. Vernon Cloninger of the Virginia Avenue Baptist Church and Rev. Howard Plowman, minister of the East Cross Methodist Church, will officiate. Interment will be beside the grave of Mrs. Hobson in White Rose Cemetery.

A native of Indiana, Hobson was born on a farm in Washington County, and during his youth his family moved to near Humboldt, Kan., where he received his education. He was married March 3, 1924 at La Crosse, Kan., to Mrs. Minnie R. Leslie. They established their home at Nekoma for a short period before moving to Alexander, Kan. The couple came to Bartlesville in January of 1943. He was employed by the Labadie Heights School until his retirement in 1950. Mrs. Hobson died May 6, 1951. He was a member of the Methodist Church, Nekoma.

Surviving are three daughters, Mrs. Wilma Thompson, 112 N.E. Cholwell, Mrs. Clayton C. Stieben, 311 N.E. Meadowlark, both of Bartlesville, and Mrs. Harold R. Cowan, Pryor; two sons, Robert W. Hobson, Tonkawa, and Dewey Hobson Newton, Burbank, Calif.; one brother, Bailey Hobson, southwest of Bartlesville; one sister, Mrs. Frank Holmes, 1025 South Oak, Bartlesville; fourteen grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Herbert Reid A Suicide

Herbert Alfred Reid, 31 year old manager of the R. and S. Beverage company, Hutchinson, shot and killed himself with a 20 guage shotgun as he sat in his motor car three and a half miles north of 30th and Monroe streets in Hutchinson, Sunday morning.

No note was found and no exact motive was announced although his wife has been ill.

Reid's body was found by Jerry Evans and John Eichman, both of Hutchinson. They were hunting a short distance away and heard a shot. Investigating, they found Reid with a shotgun barrell end in his mouth, a large hole blown out in the back of his head.

Dr. D. A. Chickering, coroner, pronounced a verdict of suicide.

Reid had held the single shotgun in his right hand and had pulled the trigger with his left.

Reid had lived in Hutchinson seven years. He was born July 10, 1915, in Natoma and for many years the family resided in La Crosse.

He is survived by his widow, Opal; a son, Leslie and a daughter, Allene Louise, all of the home; his mother, Mrs. Eitta Reid, 205 East Seventh; his father, Charles Reid, sr., Compton, Calif.; two sisters, Loree and Shiria both of 205 East Seventh; and four brothers, Charles, jr., Holyrood, Dale, Hutchinson, Everett, U.S. Navy, and Edward, Long Beach.

Following recovery from wounds sustained in Europe, Mr. Stieben returned to Kansas and managed grain elevators for Gano and Co-Op companies. He was married to Virginia Hobson at Hutchinson, Kansas on January 7, 1944. Upon relocating his family to Bartlesville, Mr. Stieben began his twenty-four year employment with Phillips Petroleum Company at the Phillips Research Center. He and Virginia were later self-employed in retail sales until their retirement in 1991.

Son Of Dewey Couple Dies In Auto Accident

Leroy Marvin Folkerts, 26, son of Mrs. Wilma Pollet Adams, of Dewey, died Sunday in the Valley Medical Center, San Jose, Calif., of injuries sustained on Saturday in an automobile accident on the San Tomas Expressway in San Jose. Police said Folkerts' small compact car was stopped at the signal light northbound on San Tomas Expressway when his vehicle was rear-ended by a pickup truck. The gas tank of

Folkerts' auto exploded and the crash impact had jammed the car doors, trapping him inside, officers said. Folkerts finally was able to roll down a window and climb out. Passersby rolled him on the ground to extinguish the fire on his clothes. Police said the truck skidded 117 feet, then smacked the Folkerts car which went 57 feet forward before rolling to a halt.

Mr. Folkerts was born Aug. 15, 1947 in Lamed, Kan., and moved to Bartlesville later. He graduated in 1965 from Dewey High School and then entered the U. S. Navy and served one year in Vietnam. Following his discharge in 1969, he attended Brigham Young University and graduated in May, 1973. He was employed as an assistant department manager for F.M.C. in San Jose, Calif., at the time of his death.

He is survived by his mother, Mrs. Wilma Pollet Adams, of Dewey; his father, Mr. Marvin Folkerts, Wichita, Kan.; one sister, Marjorie Laurie Derby, Kan.; his step-mother, Mrs. Marie Folkerts, Wichita, Kan.; a step-grandmother, Mrs. A. J. Lambert Dewey; a step-brother, Buddy Bill Urz, Wichita; and a foster sister, Mrs. Patricia Gale, Wichita.

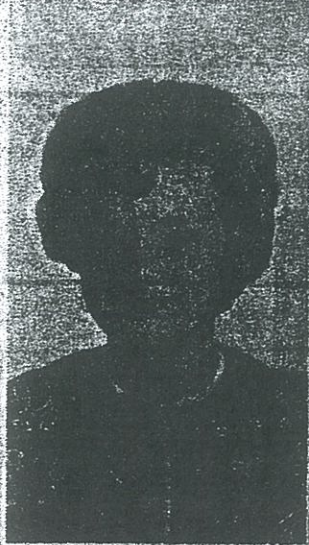
